## 6.1. President - Katie McGillivary Elgie

- We wanted to thank the Ice Pack for their willingness to move up when the AX team requested to come down to tier 5. The Ice Pack's willingness to move up to tier 5 made it significantly easier to accommodate AX request to move down as we did not need to redo the whole schedule. Thank you to Carissa and LAK for their work on the schedule to make this move happen.
- We wanted to take a minute to remind teams that they need to review the code of conduct. We have had a number of incidents this season that warrant this reminder. Under no circumstances are discrimination of any form acceptable on the ice. SAWHA needs to be a safe place for all to play. Teams need to remember that they need to respect their self, others and follow personal maturity and constant vigilance with respect to safety, as well as personal, team, and league character and integrity.
- There have been some communications to the Board about the level of competition including a wide range of teams in tiers and some lopsided games in the tiers this season. One of SAWHA's objectives is to create a space where teams enjoy the game of hockey and to keep the game at a fun yet competitive level. The board has discussed going back to doing seeding rounds every year but we recognize that this doesn't necessarily solve the problem and creates a lot of work. We've also discussed tier re-alignment creating an additional tier to help accommodate

the differences in abilities in tiers. However, this also doesn't necessarily change the problem because teams change over the years and throughout the season. As such, if anyone has any suggestions or thoughts on tier structure and competition within the tier please let us know (via email.)

- We are looking into purchasing a new league and team management platform called The Players Bench
  - Has a built-in scheduling system which would save hours of manual work for our Scheduler.
  - You can use it to make payments to the league
  - Each player has their own Player's Bench account and players are associated to a team.
  - You can only view your own team.
  - Central access point for information
    - Online registration
    - Secured online payments
    - Schedule, Stats, Standings, and more
    - Attendance Tracker and Line-Ups
    - League and Team Messaging
  - Could possible act as our new website and save teams the money of using Team Snap.
  - Cost is \$1500 for the SalesForce License (League cover cost?) and then it is \$7 per player to register.
- We would like to have some neutral people test this so it is not just a board decision.
